IF YOU want to save money when shopping, the simple rule that you've probably shouted at the kids 100 times: don't touch anything! Touching anything, from a banana to a Ferrari, makes your brain automatically place more ²_____ on an item.

This has been revealed in a study from Ohio and Illinois state universities, which investigated how much people were 3_____ to pay for an item before and after touching it. The item was a cheap coffee mug, but just a few seconds of contact made people want to pay more for it than those who had looked but not touched.

The study, published in the journal Judgment and Decision-Making, tested 144 people and examined how much they were prepared to pay in an auction for the mug, 4_____ how long they had held it. The 5_____ people held the mug, the more they were prepared to pay, with those holding it for ten seconds valuing it at \$2.44 and those who held it for 30 seconds valuing it at \$3.91.

Some kinds of stores have been using these tactics for years; for example, car showrooms customers to test drive new cars and pet stores give people animals to hold. But Waleed Muhanna, the author of the study, was surprised at how quickly people felt that, once they had touched something, it was theirs. "People become attached and are prepared to pay more to avoid ⁷_____ the object," he said. He hopes that understanding how quickly they can get attached to something may help 8_____ to make better decisions about what to buy.
