




And there's a very big goat.

'I'm *very* hungry!' says the big red goat.







'Look!' says the little goat. 'Look at the grass!'


The three goats see a bridge. But there's a troll under the bridge. He's a bad troll.

'OK,' says the troll.


And the little goat goes over the bridge.

But the troll's hungry.


'Come here!' he says. 'I want to eat *you*!'

He runs at the troll.


'Tip! Tap! Tip! Tap!' go his feet.






