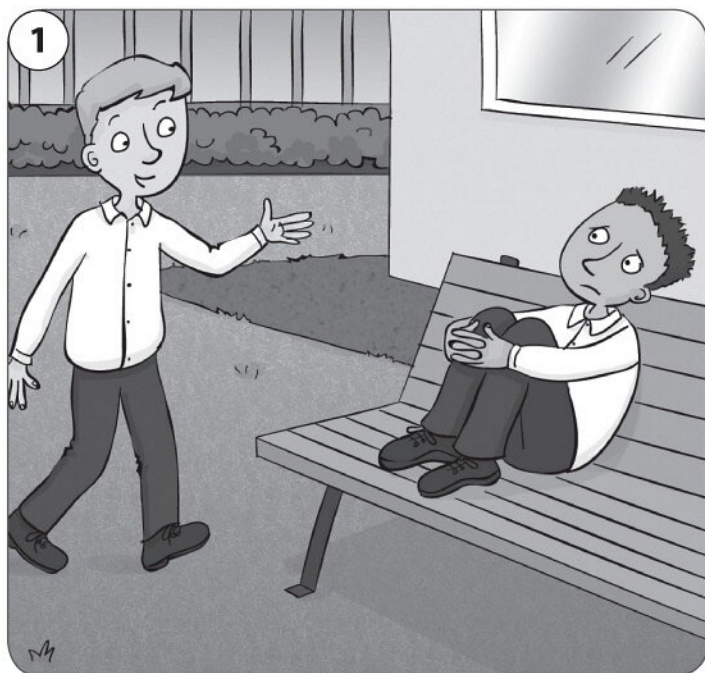

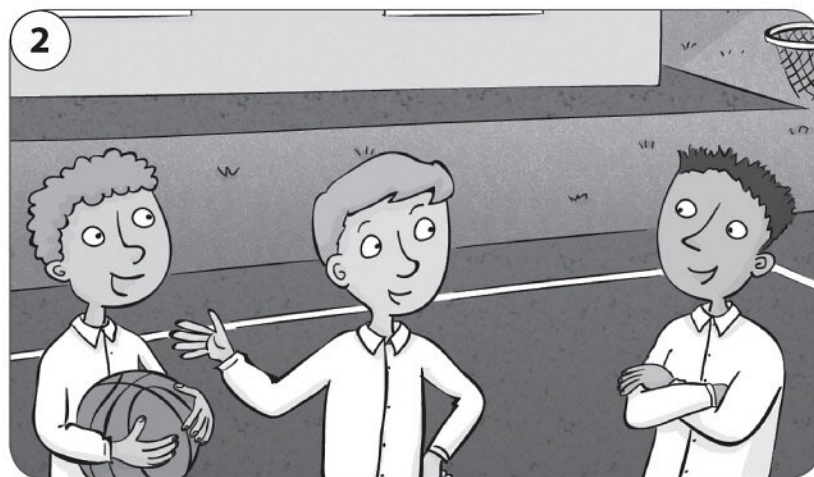
**Peter** Oh dear!
