There are many different sections of the wall that you can visit. The following information is for the Badaling section of the wall.

Where is it?

The Badaling section of the wall is 70 kilometres away from Beijing, the capital city of China. The journey takes one hour from Beijing by bus or car.

What is The Great Wall of China?

The Great Wall of China is the largest and longest wall in the world. It is about 8,850 kilometres long. It is made of bricks, stone and earth. It is thought that several huge walls were built in the 5th century B.C. Later, in 221 B.C., the walls were connected to make one long wall to protect China. Then the Great Wall was rebuilt and extended over the next 2,000 years.

The wall which visitors can see today was built in the 15th century. Historians think that the wall was once guarded by more than one million men. Today, you can still see some of the towers which the men used to send messages along the wall and all across the country.

Why visit?

The Great Wall of China is an incredible sight. There are many different sections of the wall, so you can visit one section or all of the sections. The Badaling section is the closest to Beijing. The Badaling section of the Great Wall is 7.8 metres high and 5 metres wide. It has a museum and a theatre, so visitors can learn about the history of the Great Wall.
