#### Before you go

- Find out information about where you are going.
- Buy a map.
- Always tell someone where you are going and when you will be back.

#### What to wear

 Wear lots of layers of clothing. The higher you go up a mountain, the colder it can be.

#### What to take

- matches
- water
- chocolate
- a compass
- a mobile phone
- warm clothes
- a torch
- a waterproof jacket

#### What to do if you get lost

- Don't panic! Stay calm and think about what to do.
- Call for help. If your mobile phone is working, then call the emergency services for help.
- Find shelter and stay there. If you
  move around, it will be more difficult
  for people to find you. Look for a
  cave or a hole in the ground to keep
  out of the wind and rain in.
- Stay warm. Put on your extra clothes in order to keep warm. Use your matches to start a fire.
- Stay dry. Be careful that you don't get wet. If you do, you will lose your body heat very quickly.
- Be easy to see. Your fire will be bright and give off smoke which people might see. If you have anything brightly coloured, put it on the ground or on the bushes around you so that your rescuers can see it.


