Child 2 And where will the basketball team meet?

Child 3 And where will the art club meet?

Child 4 And where will the football club meet?

Child 3 We can't let this happen! We have to do something!

Child 1 Yes! Maybe we can raise the money to repair the club!

Child 2 Let's arrange a meeting with everyone from the youth club to talk about it.

Child 3 OK! Let's meet at the club house on Wednesday at 4 o'clock. We can think of how we can save the club!

Scene 2 The meeting

Child 3 Hello everyone! Welcome to the meeting. It's great to see so many people here.
I know you all want to save the club as much as we do.

Child 2 So, we need to raise money to repair the club house. The question is, what can we do to raise money? Has anyone got any ideas?

Child 5 We could wash people's cars!

Child 6 Or we could make lemonade and sell it at school!

Child 7 Or we could have a cake sale.

Child 3 Those are good ideas. But we need to raise a lot of money.

Child 1 I like the idea of a cake sale. Everyone likes cake!

Child 3 Yes, that's true ... I know! Let's make a giant cake! The biggest cake in the world!

Child 1 That's a great idea! We can ask our friends and families to bring a cake in a square shape. And then we can put all the small cakes together and build a giant cake!

Child 2 We can build a giant cake in the shape of a club house!

Child 3 Then we can sell pieces of the giant cake to everyone in the town! And with the money, we can fix the club house!

All That's a fantastic idea! Let's do it!



Scene 3 The big day

Child 1 This is brilliant. There are so many cakes!

(Child 1 points to several tables that are full of square cakes.)

Child 2 I'm sure we'll make enough money to save the club house!

Child 3 OK, let's start building our giant cake club house!

Child 4 Yes! Let's see. We can use these cakes for the walls. We can put a layer of cream between each layer so the cakes stick together and don't fall down!

Child 3 And we can use cream to make the windows and the door.

Child 2 What about the roof? It will be very high. Do we have a ladder?

Child 1 Yes, I brought a ladder.

Child 4 Good! And we can use these cakes for the roof. Let's start building!

(Enter headmaster's wife, who is smiling as she walks towards the children.)

Headmaster's wife Hello, children. What a wonderful idea you had! The whole town is here to see your giant cake club house! And everyone is excited about eating all the cake after it's built!

Child 1 Great! Building a giant club house cake is a lot of fun!

Headmaster's wife Can I help you?

Child 3 Yes, of course! Take a cake and start building!

Scene 4 Disaster!

Child 1 It's finished! Wow – it looks fantastic.

Child 2 There are some journalists here! They want to take a picture of us and ask us some questions for their newspaper articles. Are we ready?

(Child 2 points towards the newspaper journalists who are standing ready with their cameras and notebooks.)

Child 3 Yes. We're ready! And the headmaster is ready to cut the cake!

Headmaster's wife Oh no!

Child 4 What is it?

Headmaster's wife My necklace! I was wearing my necklace and it's gone! I think it fell off ... I think it's in the cake. And it's very expensive!

Child 4 In the cake? This is terrible. What shall we do?

(The children look worried.)

Child 3 I don't know!

(The headmaster has started speaking. He hasn't seen that there is a problem.)



Headmaster First, I would like to thank these very clever children. They had a brilliant idea, and have worked very hard to raise enough money to save their club house! *(Everyone claps.)*

Headmaster Children – would you like to say something to everyone?

Child 1 Er, yes. Er, well ...

(The journalists are taking pictures of the children and the giant cake.)

Child 3 We would like to say that there is a special surprise! We have hidden a necklace in the cake! The person who finds it will win a special prize!

(The other children look surprised and pleased.)

Child 1 That was a brilliant idea! Well done!

(Child 1 whispers this to Child 3.)

Headmaster I will now cut the first slice of cake!

(Everyone claps again.)

Scene 5 **No more cake!**

Child 1 That was a brilliant idea! Well done!

Child 4 Yes! You thought of it very quickly!

Headmaster's wife Oh, I hope someone finds my necklace soon!

(A man is walking quickly towards the children and the headmaster's wife.)

Man I've found the necklace in my slice of cake! It's so exciting! What have I won?

Child 3 Er, the prize is ... Er ...

Child 2 The prize is that we will bake you a cake every week for the next year!

Man Oh, thank you! I love cake!

(The man walks away.)

Headmaster's wife Oh, thank you children! I'm so happy to have my necklace back!

(The headmaster joins the children and his wife.)

Headmaster Well done children! You've saved the club house!

(All the children cheer.)

All Now, let's go and cut everyone some cake!
